


# CSE Reference Site Expands

The references section of the Council of Science Editors Web site ([www.councilscienceeditors.org/services\\_references.shtml](http://www.councilscienceeditors.org/services_references.shtml)) now includes new categories of links. Among the new categories are Acronyms, Economic Data, Maps, Measurement, and Media. Continued categories include Dictionaries, Ethics, Journals, General Information, and Grammar and Style.

The site is continuing to expand. “When I run across new links that might be useful, I’ll add them”, says the CSE Web editor, Seth Beckerman. “It’s always



going to be a work in progress.”

The original references section was compiled in 1999 from a list of sites used by Judy Dickson, a member of the CSE

Web site editorial board. Dickson is a freelance author’s editor.

Beckerman says the section can provide valuable tools for research. “It’s a good starting point”, he said. “It may be particularly useful for people starting out in the profession or for students.”
